- · Accreditation will be given to colleges based on ratings, with certain autonomy granted.
- · A learning program will be developed to assist parents in teaching children up to age 3 and preschool-age children (3-6 years).
- · There will be multiple entry and exit points in courses, and a credit system will allow students to pause their studies and return later.

- · All school exams will be conducted in semesters, twice a year.
- · The syllabus will focus on core knowledge.
- · Greater emphasis will be placed on practical knowledge and its application.
- · Students completing different durations of study will receive certificates:
- o 1 year: Basic Certificate
- o 2 years: Diploma Certificate
- o Full course: Degree Certificate
- · All graduation courses will be governed by a single authority, with capped numbers for each course.
